


WORSHIP NOTES

Occasional Reflections on the Elements of Worship

These reflections are written by Village's staff, and it is our hope that knowing a bit more about some of the individual components of the church service may help us to experience more fully the gifts of this time together.

Confirmation

written by Rev. Zach Walker

Confirmation is the process by which adolescents learn more about faith, preparing them for the choice to join the church. The class is first available to 9th graders and meets each Sunday from January through April. In addition to learning about the building blocks of faith, students interact with each other to discuss questions and hear others' thoughts about the topic of the day. It is called "Confirmation" because at the end of the process, students can choose whether they would like to confirm the promises made for them during baptism, promises made by their parents/guardians, but that the students are now old enough to consider and speak for themselves.

THE CHURCH'S BOOK (Week of May 8, 2017)

The following daily Bible readings were written by the 2017 Confirmation class and are offered for your own personal devotion. You are invited to read the text, think about the reflection and questions and allow these to lead you in a time of prayer. Pray for your own journey of faith. Pray for Village Church and our mission. Pray for God's world.

Monday, May 8

Psalm 140:1-5

In a time of constant conflict, we often turn to an "eye for an eye" approach. We fight fire with fire, and we match the enemy's violence with violence of our own. This passage reminds us that the Lord will protect us from all evil, and it is our duty to stray away from the war and bloodshed that surrounds us.

Tuesday, May 9

Matthew 7:24-27

This verse comes from the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus tells the story of building your house on a rock rather than the sand, God is like your foundation. He supports you all your life. The stronger the connection with the Lord, the sturdier foundation you will have.

Wednesday, May 10

Jonah 2:1-10

These verses were reminders to the Confirmation class of their childhood in Sunday school. They learned then that these verses are good to read when you have feelings of despair and are looking for hope. Where in your life do you need some hope right now?

Thursday, May 11

Psalm 61:1-8

This Psalm gives assurance of God's protection and presence. Knowing God is always by your side can be difficult at times in this world, but is a great comfort as we trust in God's faithfulness.

Friday, May 12

Zechariah 7:8-10

A stark reminder, not only to us but to everyone, that there is no excuse for being unkind. Never forget that one cannot truly know what is going on in another's life.

Saturday, May 13

Philippians 4:10-13

In this letter from Paul, written in jail, he shares "the secret of being content in any and every situation." These verses give you the ability to feel both hopeful and humble. God's strength will allow you to get through everything in life; good or bad, God is always there.
