Linda Alley - Linda has made significant contributions to Village Church and PW since joining the church in 1986. She has been a member of the choir, served on the More Love Chorale leadership team, and sang in this year's Tidings of Joy

concert. She has served as a Sunday School teacher for elementary, junior high and high school students and was a confirmation small-group instructor twice. Dennis Cobb joined the Village Church staff on Feb. 28 as the new director of the Village Church Food Pantry and Clothes Closet. After a three-month search, the Food Pantry Director Search Team (Jim Bolton, Mark Bonavia, Julie Haas, Randy Johnson, Rev. Dr. Rodger Nishioka, Jim Ogden, Susan Webb and Deborah White) welcomed Dennis who will take over pantry leadership following the retirement of current pantry director, Susan Webb, at the end of this month.

Dennis comes to the Village Church Food Pantry from the Presbytery of Chicago where he worked as internal communications and administrative manager. Prior to his tenure at the Presbytery, he has worked within Presbyterian Church settings for several years as a

church administrative assistant, manager of assembly programming at the PC (USA) office and a pastoral leader for congregations in Wisconsin and Kansas.

Dennis has a Master of Divinity degree from San Francisco Theological Seminary, a Juris Doctor from the University of Kansas School of Law and a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Wichita State University. In addition to his administrative experience, Dennis has been associated with several food pantries including starting one. He has also overseen staff and volunteers in a variety of roles throughout his career.

Dennis's husband is Rev. Dale Jackson, the presbyter for vision and leadership at Heartland Presbytery. Since moving to the Kansas City area last summer, much of their free time has been spent on home improvement projects as they shape their house into their home. They enjoy the arts, especially live theater, as well as keeping up with the activities of their seven grandchildren.

#### Refugee Move In

#### Rev. Hallie Hottle, pastor for Young Adult Ministry, shares exciting news:

We've had some new friends move to town! The Mohmand family arrived in Kansas City in early December, along with a large wave of Afghan refugees coming from military bases where they had been quickly processed in their evacuation from Afghanistan. Without houses immediately available, Jewish Vocational Services (JVS) helped this family—and so many others—find refuge in hotels as they worked to find available homes.

We have been working with JVS since last November, pulling together donations and volunteers in order to be ready to help this family when the time came. On Saturday, Feb. 12, 18 volunteers from Village Church packed our vehicles with 108 donated items and drove to northeast Kansas City to prepare the family's first home in their new country. Our volunteers did quick work, cleaning the house from top to bottom, erecting IKEA bunkbeds for the family's four children, and not leaving until boxes of toys, books, art supplies, and soccer balls had been unpacked and stocked.

Holding tight our command to love one another, and with our ancient story reminding us that we, too, have been strangers in foreign lands, doing what we are able to help some new friends settle into this new land is simply what we are called to do as Jesus' followers. We will continue to work with JVS to provide support for this family in the days and weeks ahead.
