Meneilly Visiting Scholar Lisa Sharon Harper March 5 & 6

The Meneilly Visiting Scholar Committee has announced that Lisa Sharon Harper will be our 2021Visiting Scholar. Her presentations on "Post Election Faith and Politics" will be offered in a Zoom webinar starting at 7 p.m. Friday, March 5, and 9 a.m. Saturday, March 6. There is no cost to participate.

One of Lisa Sharon Harper's cherished beliefs is "Everything wrong really can be made right." In fact, this is the subtitle

of her book, "The Very Good Gospel" (2016). With a forward by Walter Brueggemann, the book reminds us that God calls us to recognize and cultivate God's image in all of creation—to restore every broken relationship in our world, our communities, and our own lives.

Ms. Harper's timely topic, "Post Election Faith and Politics," will consist of three presentations: "Four Words That Change Everything;" "The Call to Beloved Community," and "How to Repair What Race Broke in the World." This program will be interactive and presented online, with the same Friday night and Saturday morning format of previous programs.

Dedicated to bridging divides and building the beloved community, Ms. Harper is founder and president of FreedomRoad.us, a consulting group seeking to foster common understanding and commitment. She is a fervent advocate of Shalom—that every person is made in the image of God and to diminish the value and ability of any person is to diminish the image of God.



Ms. Harper holds a Master's Degree in Human Rights from Columbia University. She is a columnist at Sojourners Magazine and an Auburn Theological Seminary Senior Fellow. Previously she served as chief church engagement officer for Sojourners, and is an author, activist, speaker, blogger and podcaster. In addition to "The Very Good Gospel," Ms. Harper co-authored: "Evangelical Does Not Equal Republican...or Democrat" (2008), "Left, Right & Christ: Evangelical Faith in Politics" (2011); "Forgive Us: Confessions of a Compromised Faith" (2014), and contributed to "Still Evangelical? Insiders Reconsider Political, Social, and Theological Meaning" (2018). Her newest book, "Fortune: My Journey to Understand How Race Broke My Family and the World–and How to Repair It All," is scheduled for release in December 2021.

Session Update

At the Jan. 4 Session meeting held by Zoom, Rev. Tom Are outlined the budget process for this year. A Budget Task Force would meet on Jan. 20. Session members would be asked to approve the 2021 budget at its Feb. 1 meeting. The budget will be shared with the congregation by mail.

Rev. Are told Session that we are looking for people to serve on an Associate Pastor Nominating Committee to begin the search for a new site pastor at Village on Antioch (VOA). The appointment of the APNC requires a congregational vote, which will be conducted by mail-in ballot. Meanwhile, a job description is in development for an interim site pastor at VOA.

SESSION UPDATE continued

In anticipation of the church reopening sometime in 2021, Session will convene a lay person/staff task force (which will include medical professionals) to guide us on when and how to reopen. At the time the Good News went to print (Jan. 26), the Session's suspension of on-site worship was set to expire after Jan. 31, 2021. Session will vote on whether to extend on-site worship suspension at its Feb. 1 meeting. Session has been reassessing the suspension of on-site worship in three-month increments. Decisions are based on COVID infection rates in Johnson County.

Village Church Responds to Greater Community Food Needs Due to COVID

Village Church Food Pantry Director Susan Webb gives us an update on 2020: "We at the Village Food Pantry are looking forward to the New Year, knowing that we met the challenges of 2020 in our mission work. Since June, we have been blessed to offer full grocery carts to each household using outdoor curbside distribution. Through snow, rain and summer heat, we plan to continue offering this assistance in 2021.


After closing last spring for COVID-19, we reorganized and were able to serve 12,338 individuals in 2020. The number of children we served on a weekly basis increased by 40% since last January and the number of seniors receiving delivered food increased by 49%. We shared food with other pantries in our community, including 12,370 pounds given to the Village on Antioch popup pantry. In 2020, we distributed 186.7 tons of food! We are grateful to Trader Joe's, Ranchmart

Price Chopper and Harvesters for providing the bulk of our inventory through donations and purchases.

Unfortunately, to allow for 6 feet social distancing, we had to greatly reduce the total number of volunteers participating. This much smaller, but hearty crew of volunteers worked 9,566 hours last year.

In 2021, we will continue with curbside distribution, deliveries to low-income seniors and distributions to other pantries. We look forward to the day when we welcome back ALL our volunteers, reopen the Clothes Closet and return to full service inside the building.

Thank you to all who supported this mission in many ways during a difficult



An Update on the Village on Antioch Pop-Up Food Pantry from Coordinator Laura Patton

When the COVID-19 pandemic forced a community-wide shut-down last March, the Village on Antioch community opened a pop-up food pantry in our Fellowship Hall. In late spring, we packed

bags for Olathe School District children who needed food support during the weekends – between the days they were receiving meals from school.

By summer, we were ready to begin Community Food Distributions. Between June 3 and Dec. 30, we fed about 1,116 families. The guests who most often visit our distributions live in zip codes 66062 (east Olathe), 66102 (Wyandotte Co), 66223 (Overland Park–Blue Valley School District), and 66212 (Overland Park–Shawnee Mission School District). Three of our guests have come to every distribution. On average, our guests have come to three distributions.



The VOA Coordinating Council has committed to continuing food distributions

through May 2021. Our food pantry earned a \$16,000 CARES Act grant via Johnson County Government. This money will help us add gift cards to our food packages so that our guests can buy produce, dairy, eggs and meat that we are not able to provide. Although we are excited about this opportunity, we are also hopeful that the health and economic vitality of our KC community will be restored in 2021. We started our pop-up food pantry as a stop-gap measure; we would like to no longer be needed in better days ahead.

Village Church Mission Sewing Churns Out More Than 6,399 Items in 2020

Despite the pandemic closing down the Mission Sewing room at Village Church, the team continued its work from their machines at home during COVID. As a result, 5,714 volunteer hours resulted in more than 7,000 items donated to area nonprofits.

Among the many items created, the most prolific donation was facemasks. After the church closed in mid-March, Mission Sewing groups jumped into action with home sewing in April and May to produce masks to help fight the coronavirus. By the end of June, the Tuesday group had made and distributed 1,283 face coverings. An additional 144 were made for Village Church staff. The Thursday group made 154 for church and childcare staff, bringing the total to over 1,500. At 30 minutes per mask, volunteers spent an estimated 750 hours just on these face coverings.

Then the call came from Southminster Church to help with masks for the VA. With this donation, Village Sewing conservatively estimated volunteers made over 2,000 masks in total...not including masks that others quietly made on their own and distributed until they became available on commercial markets.

In addition to making facemasks, Mission Sewing knitted and crocheted winter hats, mittens, afghans and receiving blankets, completed 44 robes for youth in Avenue of Life's Unaccompanied Homeless Youth House and constructed Dream Bags for foster children in the Kansas Department for Children and Families system.

"The numbers this year do not reflect the story," shares Cheryl Brady, one of the coordinators of Mission Sewing. "We continue to function from home studios, bound by a love of sewing and a desire to be of service to those in need of our skills and products. For many in the group, having something to keep hands and minds occupied has indeed been a blessing."
