Travel with Mark in the Sermon Series "Life in the Wilderness"

Three decades after the ministry of Jesus, life was chaotic for Christians in the Roman empire. Serious earthquakes occurred. Christians became scapegoats for the disastrous fire that destroyed much of Rome, and as a result, were rounded up and put to death by the most horrific means. A Jewish revolt was put down by the Roman Army, leaving the temple in Jerusalem destroyed—again. During this tumultuous time, someone we call Mark wrote the first Gospel. He tells the story that changes the world.

In this sermon series, which runs Jan. 2-April 17, we will travel with Mark from the beginning to the resurrection. Life 2,000 years after Jesus remains chaotic, but perhaps this story will change us. Mark bears witness that there can be abundant life even in the wilderness.

Star Words for 2022 are Available

Star Words have become a modern-day ritual related to Epiphany (Jan. 6), when the wise ones are believed to have reached the Christ child by following the star. Like the wise ones, we seek Jesus, trusting that God uses many paths to bring us closer to the Divine.

Star Words are paper or wooden stars with one word on each related to our spiritual life in Christ. You are encouraged to simply draw a star out of the basket and thus let the word choose you (rather than hunting through the basket for a word you like). The idea is to journey with your word through the coming year—to watch where it shows up, how it moves your heart and the ways it brings you closer to God.

If you missed worship on Jan. 2, baskets of Star Words will be available on Sunday, Jan. 9. (At our Mission Campus, these will be in the Narthex, Welcome Center and Friendship Hall. At our Antioch Campus, they will be at the Welcome desk.) After Jan. 9, Star Words will be available at the south reception desk at our Mission Campus or in the Antioch Campus office.
