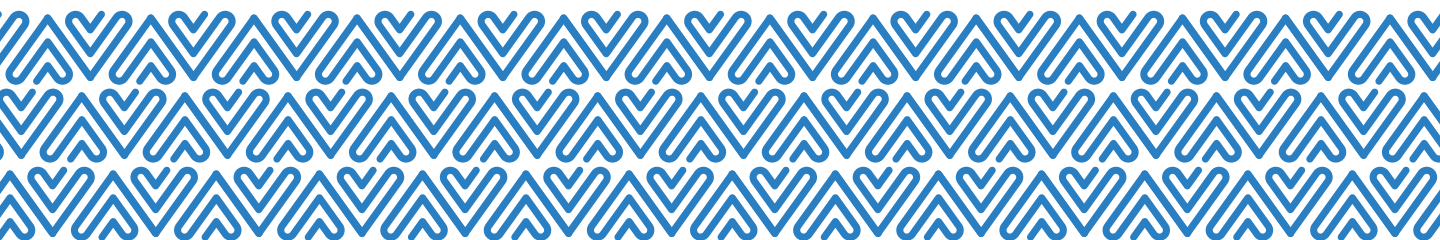


WELCOME TO VILLAGE CHURCH
