Herman's print shows wildly twisting arms, hands and fingers, evoking the convoluted motives of those who encounter Christ's Passion. We've cheered the arrival of Christ in Jerusalem; yet only a few days later we're lunging out from the dark, blue-gray shadows with a jagged thorn-crown, implanting it on his stately head. We're shouting, "Crucify Him!" instead of "Hosanna!"

MISSION

One Great Hour – On Palm Sunday, Village Church collects for One Great Hour of Sharing.
