

Vaughan Williams' "O Clap Your Hands" is perhaps the best-known choral setting of Psalm 47, a hymn-psalm addressed to the 'Chief Musician.' The language feels a bit stoic and old-fashioned since Vaughn Williams was using the King James version of the psalm. Our more modern interpretation might refer to God as 'awe-inspiring' rather than 'terrible,' for instance. Whatever the language, the point of the psalm is clear: our God is energetic, wise and protective. Let us praise God with all that we are!
