The arborvitae anchors the garden with several native shrubs and flowers filling the space between them. Coral honeysuckle grows over the entrance arbor attracting hummingbirds and butterflies. Please consider assisting with the maintenance of this beautiful Prayer Labyrinth.

Every other month on the second Friday, Village Church serves a meal to 150-250 people at the <u>Cross-Lines Kitchen</u>. We need three to four volunteers to cook in the morning (10-11 a.m.) and three to four additional volunteers to help serve (11 a.m.–1 p.m.). Besides the volunteer cooks and servers, we also need folks to provide three to four dozen cookies. These are to be dropped off at the reception desk by 4:30 p.m. on the Thursday before the Village Friday meal service.

Village Church started <u>Front Porch Alliance</u> (FPA) in partnership with the Ivanhoe neighborhood (31st to 47th Street, Paseo to Prospect) in 1999 in hopes of building a meaningful and supportive relationship with an underserved community. To this day, FPA works hand in hand with Kansas City's east side residents and community partners to build youth leadership and opportunities for families to make positive, lasting changes in their lives and neighborhoods. There are a variety of ways to share your talents with this worthy organization.

Village Church sponsors the construction of a house each year through <u>Habitat for Humanity Kansas City</u>. The majority of the work on that house is carried out by the Tuesday-Thursday Crew, a collection of volunteers of all skill levels who either work or are retired from careers totally unrelated to home building. The only essential trait is a strong desire to create decent housing for lowincome families. Volunteer opportunities for students and working adults are available on Saturdays.

Since 2002, Johnson County Home Delivered Meals (formerly Meals on Wheels) has been delivering nutritious meals to homebound, elderly and those with disabilities and their spouses, age 60 years and older, helping them stay independent, healthy, and safe at home. Currently, the program serves over 600 individuals each day.

Village Church has three teams who deliver meals every Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Each volunteer signs up for one day in the month and if a conflict arises with their regular delivery date, it is easy to trade dates with another team member. Volunteers deliver meals between 10:45 a.m.-noon.

Helping Hands volunteers assist with basic household tasks, yard work or provide meals to church members who may need help, such as the elderly, infirm, housebound, or those caring for new babies or aging relatives. All tasks are short-term; simply sign up for any that fit your schedule.

Volunteers share their time and energy to keep the Memorial Garden at Village Church a beautiful and peaceful place. Tasks include light weeding, checking that floral arrangements are fresh, and maintaining garden policies.

Become a member of the Memorial Guild. Ushers will greet guests attending a memorial service, and Memorial Reception volunteers host a reception following a memorial service.

Stephen Ministry volunteers provide one-on-one, confidential care to those in the midst of challenging life circumstances. 50 hours of required training is provided for Stephen Ministry certification.

<u>Unexpected Blooms</u>, a registered nonprofit, accepts flowers donated from weddings, memorial services, charity, corporate and private events, florists, and retailers. Volunteers recut, refresh and repurpose those flowers to create beautiful bouquets that we deliver to seniors in healthcare facilities to brighten their days.

Concert Greeter	Music Ministry offers several concerts throughout the year usually on Sunday afternoons or evenings. These concerts are free to the public. Being a concert greeter offers a way to serve the church and show hospitality to people attending.
Reception Volunteer	At times a reception will be planned to follow a concert in order to allow the audience to meet a special soloist(s) or to make the concert a way to showcase an agency that is the designated recipient of a special offering. Volunteers will help set up, tear down, and make sure the reception runs smoothly.

Music Library	The various music ensembles use music folders. Getting the music that's required for these various groups ready for distribution means processing new music or filing music that has been used. A music library volunteer can serve the church by helping with this process either weekly or when there's a larger sorting job following Christmas or Easter.
Christmas Candle Preparation	There are 3,000 Christmas Eve candles for the congregation prepared each year the week before Dec. 24. This task is accomplished by volunteers who give two hours of their time. Treats and fellowship are always a fun part of this task.
