

Monday, Oct. 28

Psalm 145

Yesterday we concluded our sermon series on prophets, and Sunday we'll begin a new series looking towards stewardship. But for today, for right now, we root our week in this morning psalm of praise. Read and meditate. Offer up your own praise for the goodness around you.

Tuesday, Oct. 29

Revelation 4:1-11

This is a strange reading for today. We often get caught in the symbolism of Revelation, and prevent ourselves from experiencing it as story. This week brings to us three holy days that aren't widely celebrated in our presbyterian tradition, that give us opportunity to consider our heavenly beyond. Use this reading today to let yourself imagine the beauty of heaven. Here we find jasper and emerald and seas like crystal. What do you imagine heaven is like? Let yourself wonder.

Wednesday, Oct. 30

Revelation 5:1-10

In this reading we encounter harps and "golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints." It's a strange, beautiful image. What's it like to imagine your prayers as incense, filling the heavens with fragrance? Offer up some prayers today, burn some incense if you can, and give special thanks for your friends of faith - the other saints in your midst adding your name into those heavenly bowls of incense.

Thursday, Oct. 31

Psalm 130

Today is Halloween! Halloween, or All Hallows' Eve, begins a three-day celebration to remember those we have loved and lost. Some traditions believe that the realms of heaven and earth come close this night, so candles are lit to welcome the souls of those we love. If you've never tried it, light some candles tonight at sunset, and pray in thanksgiving for those you know who now rest with God.

Friday, Nov. 1

Today is All Saint's Day! It's the day we remember all our "saints," which is what we, as protestants, call all who have died. Continue to light your candles from yesterday, and give thanks for our all our saints, especially all those who have joined the Church Triumphant from Village Church this year.

Saturday, Nov. 2

Today is All Soul's Day! It concludes this three-day celebration of all those who have died. Our friends in Mexico use this day to visit the gravesides of those they love, and leave decorations or gifts. Some prepare the favorite meal of someone no longer with us, and enjoy it with family and friends as they remember and celebrate that life. The traditions of those who most actively practice these days do so with fanfare and joy. If your heart is achy with loss this year, try something new, and seek the joy of knowing that death is not the end.
