ABOUT THE LITURGICAL ART

The Worship Arts Committee, with help from Mission Sewing, created the banner in the Sanctuary to help illustrate the current sermon series "I Believe. Help My Unbelief." As today's scripture reading describes, belief and unbelief are often tied more closely and immediately to one another than we might think. The banner is meant to evoke the paradoxical nature of this relationship: a firm object (confident belief) is reflected wavily in a body of water (but do I really believe?). The flowing green fabric is meant to draw the eye to this sometimes uncomfortable reality, and encourage us to consider how it shows up uniquely in our own faith.

A LOOK TOWARD NEXT SUNDAY . . .

Peter sat by the sea, sharing breakfast with Jesus, and received the command that shaped his life, "Feed my sheep." We have taken this command as calling for very practical efforts to care for God's people. At the same time, there is embedded in this conversation the exhortation to live as Christ would live. This is a bold request from Jesus, who evidently has more hope for us than we might have for ourselves.

THE CHURCH'S BOOK (Week of November 4, 2019)

The following daily Bible readings were written by Rev. Dr. Rodger Nishioka and are offered for your own personal devotion. You are invited to read the text, think about the reflection and questions and allow these to lead you in a time of prayer. Pray for your own journey of faith, pray for Village Church, pray for the community around you, and pray for all of creation.

Monday, Nov. 4

Mark 1:14-20

Mark's gospel begins with John baptizing Jesus, Jesus being sent into the wilderness, then Jesus proclaiming the good news. He calls on the people to repent and believe. Then, he invites the first disciples to join him. Believing and calling are intricately related in Mark's gospel. How is your believing related to your calling?

Tuesday, Nov. 5

Mark 5:21-24, 35-43

Jesus is invited to the house of a religious leader whose daughter is near death. When he arrives at the house, the child has died. Jesus says to the father, "Do not fear, only believe." Jesus is telling the father that believing is greater than fear. As you ponder your fears, know that while the fears may be strong, believing is even stronger. Pray today asking the Holy Spirit to give you the gift of believing to conquer your fears.

Wednesday, Nov. 6

Mark 9:14-29

In this amazing story of healing, Jesus promises that all can be done for those who believe. The father's response is genuine and heart wrenching: "I believe; help my unbelief!" Truthfully, all of us are caught in that liminal space between belief and unbelief. Sometimes we lean more toward belief and other times more toward unbelief. Reflect on what helps you move more toward belief and decide to do that.

Thursday, Nov. 7

Mark 9:33-37, 42

When the disciples are arguing about who is the greatest in God's kingdom, Jesus closes the argument by placing a child in their midst. Then he warns them against causing any of "these little ones" who believe in him to stumble. There is something powerful about the belief of a child. Children often are not yet tainted by adolescent and adult cynicism and skepticism. Give thanks this day for children and pray that nothing you do will ever hinder a child's belief in God.

Friday, Nov. 8

Mark 11:20-24

From cursing a fig tree to moving a mountain, Jesus tells his disciples that whatever they ask in prayer, if they believe they have received it, it will come to pass. These words have led many Christians to wonder if Jesus' words can be trusted when prayers go unanswered. Others have said that we just need to believe more. What Jesus is saying here is simply that prayer and believing are intertwined. When you pray, believe and when you believe, pray. Then, trust that God hears our prayers and is faithful.

Saturday, Nov. 9

Mark 13:14-23

Jesus is telling his followers about the coming destruction of Jerusalem and the holy temple. When those days come, he warns them about false messiahs and false prophets. He tells his disciples to not believe what they say. Jesus shows us there are times to believe and there are times not to believe. We are not to be naïve and believe everything. Pray for the Holy Spirit to help you discern when to believe and when not to believe.
