The following daily Bible readings were written by Rev. Hallie Hottle and are offered for your own personal devotion. Monday, Feb. 4

Psalm 23:1

This week we're going to parse out this beloved psalm, meditating on one verse at a time. We begin with the first line, a metaphor comparing God to a shepherd. Pull yourself away from the images of fluffy sheep on a green hillside. How would you begin this psalm of personal praise? As you meditate and pray today, let yourself compose a new metaphor. The Lord is my....

Tuesday, Feb. 5

Psalm 23:2

Green pastures and still waters. It's an image my heart longs for in chaotic or hurting seasons. It's an image that points to tomorrow's verse about restoration. How is God leading you to rest right now? What does your place of rest look like? Let your heart imagine that place, and linger there.

Wednesday, Feb. 6

Psalm 23:3

Imagine where you are right now as a point on a path. If it looks like mine, it's filled with curves and turns and about-faces. We trust that God has been there with you all along. So let yourself look back. Where can you see Holy fingerprints along your journey? Where are you certain your paths have been right? How have you given God glory there, or how might you now?

Thursday, Feb. 7

Psalm 23:4

The dark valley. The valley of the shadow of death. I think we know that place. And if we do, we know that next line, "I do not fear," is profound. The "rod and staff" are a little more elusive for me, but I have my own markers, my own signposts that have served to encourage me when traversing my valleys. Repeat this verse as your statement of faith today, and fill in our own markers. What gives you hope and assurance to endure the valleys?

Friday, Feb. 8

Psalm 23:5

A "prepared table" here is a sign of being well cared for. That table being "in the presence of enemies" points to the enduring nature of God's care. Enemies, demons, struggles and fears, they never seem to leave the room when we want them to. God doesn't wait for the hard things to be gone before the table is set. What might be preventing you from coming to the table? How might you be called to experience God's overflowing mercy, not because of or without the hardship also present, but in spite of it?

Saturday, Feb. 9

Psalm 23:6

As we end this week and this psalm, how are you aware of goodness, mercy, and kindness this day? How can you practice both noticing these, and sharing them with others? For they are present all of our days. And our noticing and practicing can surely help us to see Holy's dwelling surrounding us today, and always.
