OUR GUEST PREACHER TODAY

Village Church welcomes the Rev. Pen Peery to the pulpit today. Rev. Peery is in his sixth year serving as the senior pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in downtown Charlotte, NC. He is a native of Charlotte and a sixth-generation Presbyterian minister. In addition to being the son of two Presbyterian ministers, Pen's wife, Lindsey, is also a minister. Pen's claim to fame here at Village is that he is the brother of the Rev. Meg Peery McLaughlin and brother-in-law to the Rev. Jarrett McLaughlin, both of whom served here as associate pastors. He is a graduate of the University of North Carolina and Columbia Theological Seminary. He is currently studying for his Doctor of Ministry degree. He has served congregations in Richmond, VA, and Shreveport, LA. Pen and Lindsey have four children. He is a member of the NEXT Church strategy team with Rev. Tom Are and the board of trustees of Columbia Theological Seminary with Rev. Dr. Rodger Nishioka.

THE CHURCH'S BOOK (Week of July 9, 2018)

The following daily Bible readings were written by Rev. Len Carrell and are offered for your own personal devotion. You are invited to read the text, think about the reflection and questions and allow these to lead you in a time of prayer. Pray for your own journey of faith, pray for Village Church, pray for the community around you, and pray for all of creation.

Monday, July 9

Philippians 1:3-11

Paul prays for his friends in Philippi. He prays for their joy in sharing the gospel and affirms that God is doing good work among them. From the floor of his prison, he prays giving thanks to them for holding him in their hearts. He prays for their love to overflow in their cup. This is a letter of friendship.

Tuesday, July 10

Philippians 1:27-30

Paul reminds his friends and us to live life "worthy of the gospel of Christ" that is to live in community. He says there will be struggles living faithfully in community but to "stand firm" and to strive "side by side" in one spirit. This is "God's doing" because God has given us belief as the one body of Christ.

Wednesday, July 11

Philippians 2:1-5

Paul's lesson to be of the same mind does not mean to think the same way. On the contrary, it means learning humility as an act of rejoicing in another's joys, interests, compassions, sympathies, and love as more than our own. It means learning how to live with a mind centered on Christ, and the life of Christ as one who emptied himself and served all of God's children.

Thursday, July 12

Philippians 2:12-13

The best kind of learning is when we're all learning together. When Paul instructs us to "work out our own salvation," he is not addressing us individually. He is addressing the entire community. He is teaching that God is at work in each of us, all at the same time. So, how can we see God's work in each other? How is God working in every life around us? How do we discern together what God is calling us to be?

Friday, July 13

Philippians 3:12-16

Paul's words are a good reminder that what is ahead of us is where hope is leading us. It is a confident anticipation of things to come. The goals we strive for, the promises we hope for, is the journey before us. Our trusting that grace will lead us, is trusting that God will somehow be revealed to us in our dreams. So, let us press on until we make God's dreams our own, because Christ has made us His own.

Saturday, July 14

Philippians 4:8-9

Paul's final word is that whatever we do, whatever is true, just or pleasing, keep doing these things. Keep on learning from our faith, because by doing those things we keep God close. If we are able to think about the joy we have learned in sharing the gospel, in seeing God at work in community, in holding each other in prayer and compassion, then we will know Christ's peace in the world and within us.
