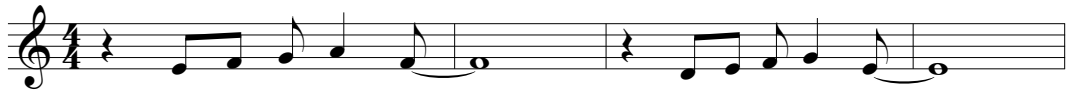

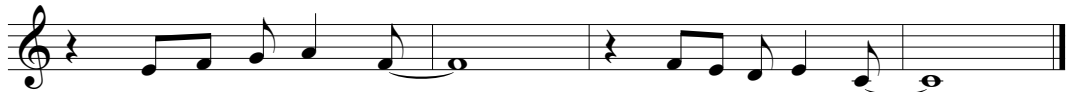

THE CHURCH'S BOOK (Week of November 27, 2017)

The following daily Bible readings were written by Molly Ramsey, VOA ministry assistant, are offered for your own personal devotion. You are invited to read the text, think about the reflection and questions and allow these to lead you in a time of prayer. Pray for your own journey of faith, pray for Village Church, pray for the community around you, and pray for all of creation.

Monday, Nov. 27

Psalm 62

The Psalmist reminds us that we find our rest in God, that our hope comes from the Lord. During this week between Thanksgiving and Advent, are you leaving time to rest? On Thanksgiving, we set apart a time to remember all that we are grateful for. A time to sing praises. A time to reflect on blessings. Let us also set aside time to rest in the One whose love is unfailing.

Tuesday, Nov. 28

Psalm 146

Praise the Lord, my soul. May these words of worship carry you through your day. Remembering to whom the designs of the world and the universe belong. Remembering that all of the things which may seem too heavy to carry, are never too big for God. Remembering that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:5). Praise the Lord, my soul.

Wednesday, Nov. 29

Psalm 147:1-11

How good it is, to sing praises to our God. Almost a week has passed since Thanksgiving, what new joys have come into your life during these six days? They may be so small, they may seem insignificant. They are not. When you put your hope in God's unfailing love, the seemingly little things become big things, by God's transformative love. Today, make a list of everything you're thankful for. Pray or sign that list to God. For how good it is, to sing praises.

Thursday, Nov. 30

Psalm 116

The Lord has not forgotten you. While there is always much to be thankful for, sometimes despair and grief are close to our hearts. The Psalmist reassures us, the Lord hears you. Just as we sing out with thanksgiving, let us cry out for comfort, for grace and for rest. Let this Psalm remind you that God has been with those who have suffered in the past and that God is with you now.

Friday, Dec. 1

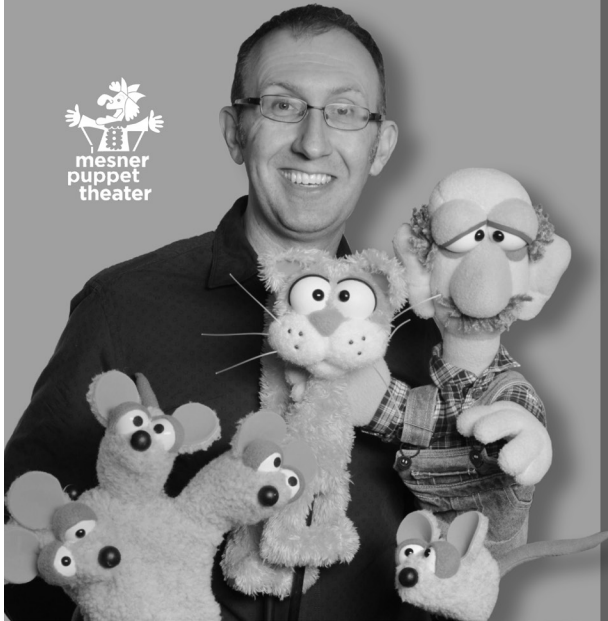
Psalm 63

You God, are my God. Today, focus your thoughts, not on who you are, but whose you are. You are a child of the living God. Your identity does not come from your job. It does not come from your family or your friends. It does not come from your income or your interests. It comes from the one who sustains. Saturday, Dec. 2

Psalm 27
